

#### Kamehameha Schools Data

- Data collection for 32 charter schools of which 17 have a Hawaiian cultural focus
- Administers three surveys
  - -Family
  - Alumni
  - -Youth

### Focus Groups Data

- Two student focus groups
  - -2003-2005 graduates
    - n=3
  - -2008 graduates
  - n=4

• n=17

- One faculty & staff focus group
  - -2012-2013 school year

### **Focus Group Questions**

- Activities since graduating
- Beneficial & meaningful experiences
- Unique features or practices
- What Ke Kula 'o Kamakau could have done better to prepare their students
- Extent of Hawaiian language & cultural practices

#### **Preliminary Recommendations**

- Comprehensive alumni tracking system
- Success be viewed with long-term lens
- Maintain or revisit high-impact learning experiences
- Explore issues around transition from Immersion to post-secondary Hawaiian language study.
